

'In Common': Reflections from the LFA2023 Curation Panel

Jordan Whitewood-Neal, Dis/ (Transcript)

Jordan: To me, the theme of 'In Common' is not just about asking what we have in common as a society, with architecture or with spaces in the city, there's also asking where we have in common - which thing is incredibly important question because it addresses the spaces that we can both inhabit and use together... or can't use together.

The reason I was so drawn to this theme was because it allows us to challenge and critique the way that we can exist within the city and the way that we can find access or challenge access to spaces that are often excluded from us.

What I'm really hoping from people who are applying to the theme and applying to do an event, is that we address the theme of in common not just as a way of questioning a space in city but a way of questioning about how we intervene within it – in terms of methodology, in terms of Co designing spaces, in terms of working together, to find a commonality in how we function but also act within the city
